SPEEDING ENFORCEMENT CAMPAIGN: OBEY THE SIGN OR PAY THE FINE

Although we enforce the Town's speed limits all year, we want you to be extra aware of your speed now that the weather will be getting warmer. Many adults, children and families will be out walking, running and biking. Watch your speed, be aware of your surroundings, no distractive driving (texting, email, social media). The Town of Wytheville town-wide speed limit is 25 MPH, unless otherwise posted. Speed limits in higher speed limit zones are clearly marked. When you leave a higher speed limit zone and enter a 25 MPH zone it is also clearly marked. Officers will be conducting concentrated speed enforcement campaigns in the Town of Wytheville. Those traveling over the posted speed limit will be ticketed. Be part of the solution and not part of the problem.



From the Wytheville Fire & Reseue Department

On Saturday, March 20, 2024, the Wytheville Fire & Rescue Department partnered with the American Red Cross and many volunteers from around the region as well as officials from the Virginia Department of Fire Programs and the State Fire Marshals office to conduct a smoke detector blitz in several neighborhoods in and around Wytheville. Firefighters and volunteers knocked on the doors of approximately 150 homes and installed 51 smoke detectors as well as discussed fire prevention with 70 residents. We could not have accomplished this without the volunteers who came from various local organizations as well as students from Emory and Henry College. Additionally, we would also like to thank several local businesses that donated food and drinks to this effort including Food Lion, Food City, Walmart, Hardees, McDonalds, Papa Johns, Dominos and Little Caesars. We greatly appreciate all those who assisted us in the Community Risk Reduction effort.

- Conducted a public hearing to consider budget appropriations for the Fiscal Year 2023-24 budget.
- Approved amending the Fiscal Year 2023-24 Budget to include appropriations to the 2023-24 General Fund Budget in the amount of \$732,500 and the Wastewater Fund Budget in the amount of \$60,886.
- Approved authorizing the Wytheville Police Department to issue a purchase order for two police vehicles with the understanding that the funds will be appropriated in the Fiscal Year 2024-25 budget.
- Scheduled Budget Work Sessions for Monday, March 25, 2024, and Monday, April 8, 2024, at 4:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building before the regularly scheduled Town Council meetings to discuss the development of the budget for Fiscal Year 2024-25.

- Approved the request of the American Cancer Society for a Waiver of Fees for the use of Withers Park on Saturday, May 4, 2024, for the Relay for Life of Wythe County event.
- Approved the request of the Wytheville Branch of American Association of University Women for the issuance of a raffle permit for calendar year 2024.
